3	The decrease in total numbers of consumers served in State Psychiatric Hospitals is due to the closing of one our state hospitals and more clients are being served by the community service providers.
4	In FY15 as compared to those served in FY14, the total number of consumers employed appears to have increased by 24%. There may be several factors which account for this increase. The ADMH provider network saw a 7.5% increase in total numbers served in FY15 as compared to FY14. Also, Alabama's Governor stated in a November 2015 Press Release that "Alabama's unemployment rate continues to drop as our economy grows." The wage and salary employment was reported at its highest level for almost 7 years. According to the Alabama Department of Labor, job growth surpassed 2015 expectations by nearly 8,000 jobs. All counties within the state, with one exception, experienced drops in the unemployment rate.
6	The decrease in total number of consumers served in state hospital at the beginning of the year and total admissions to state hospital during the year is due to the closing of one our state hospitals and more clients are being served by the community service providers.
8	The increase in total MHBG expenditures when compared to FY14 is a result of funding for MHA data collection/reporting activities. This was dedicated for the development of the DMH Gateway database system which is the web-based data system to track DMH committed patients that are served in DMH Designated Mental Health Facilities.
9	In 2015, one impact to the decrease in the percent of clients reporting positively about functioning may be that more individuals participated with the survey, 1,145 more individuals. There was a decrease amongst most all the providers serving the individuals. Alabama is in the process of transition into managed care and evolving mental health services. This is a cultural shift for both the providers and the longer term individuals. Also, there has been an increase of consumers served in community programs with the closure of three state hospitals and the transfer of this care more to the community providers. This again has consumers who have been institutionalized now being in the community who are in the process of cultural transition. Annually, DMH have provider meetings/trainings to cover the NOMS outcomes and look at how to make improvements and learning opportunities in a collaborative process and this area will be a topic we are addressing.
14A	SMI Definition: Person who meets the diagnosis and disability criteria or who meet the criteria for high risk. Disability Criteria (must meet at least 2 criteria plus diagnosis criteria).
