


2010 National Survey of Substance Abuse Treatment Services (N-SSATS) HHS Regional Report

Clients aged 18 or older in treatment for substance abuse only, per 100,000 population, by U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Regions

The National Survey of Substance Abuse Treatment Services (N-SSATS) is an annual census of facilities in the United States, both public and private, that provide substance abuse treatment. Each year, about 17,000 facilities are surveyed, and information is collected on their location, characteristics, and use of alcohol and drug treatment facilities and services throughout the 50 States, the District of Columbia, and other U.S. jurisdictions.

This report focuses on the rate, per 100,000 population of clients in treatment for substance abuse by U.S. Department of Health & Human Services Regions (Figure 1). There are 10 U.S. Department of Health & Human Services Regions (Regions 1 through 10). The data presented in this report is based on 13,339 facilities that responded to the N-SSATS survey.

The rates of clients in treatment for drug abuse only were higher than the national rate for all States in two Regions: Region 1 (Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, and Vermont) and Region 2 (New Jersey and New York). On the other hand, the rates of clients for drug abuse only were lower than the national rate for all States in two Regions: Region 5 (Minnesota, Michigan, Illinois, Indiana, Wisconsin, and Ohio) and Region 7 (Iowa, Nebraska, Missouri, and Kansas).




Figure 3. State or jurisdiction per Region with the highest rate of clients in treatment for drug abuse only, per 100,000 population: 2010




Figure 4. State or jurisdiction per Region with the lowest rate of clients in treatment for drug abuse only, per 100,000 population: 2010




Figure 5. Proportion of HHS Regions' clients in treatment for drug abuse only, alcohol and drug abuse, and alcohol only, by State or jurisdiction, compared with the total United States proportion




Figure 5 (continued). Proportion of HHS Regions' clients in treatment for drug abuse only, alcohol and drug abuse, and alcohol only, by State or jurisdiction, compared with the total United States proportion



