As such, the AMHD provides mental health services to individuals who are primarily forensically encumbered; the uninsured and the underinsured. Once individuals enter the Adult Mental Health Division system of care, and are deemed eligible for insurance, the social workers register them with the Department of Human Services, Ohana Community Care Services, which is the network of providers who provide mental health services. 6	<p>The increase in total number of consumers served in State Hospital at the beginning of the year was due to the classification of where the consumer was being served. Around 40 consumers were classified as served at other psychiatric inpatient. The increase in total admissions to state hospital during the year is due to the court system finding more consumers unfit to stand trial and forensically encumbered. That automatically sends them to the State Hospital. The increases in total number of consumers served in community programs at the beginning of the year and total admissions to community program during the year are due to: (a) psychiatric bed capacity was reduced at Hilo Medical and at Queen’s Medical Centers, which forced case managers/social workers to seek mental health services for consumers within community settings; (b) due to the high census at the Hawaii State Hospital (HSH), more consumers have been discharged and placed in the community due to a lack of bed space. The decrease in total number of consumers served in other psychiatric inpatient settings at the beginning of the year is due to misclassification of consumers under other Psychiatric Inpatient. Around 40 consumers are correctly classified as served in State Hospital. The decrease in total admissions to other psychiatric inpatient during the year is due to the classification of a few consumers admitted to the state hospital last year as being served in other psychiatric facility. The decreases in total number of consumers served in residential treatment centers at the beginning of the year and total admissions to residential treatment centers during the year were due to providers not accurately responding to the questions in the QOLI. The AMHD is in the position to facilitate refresher training for providers, due to contracting with new providers and new staff. The decrease in average LOS of adults discharged from State Hospitals and increase in average LOS of adults (in facility < 1 year) who were state hospital residents at the end of the year are due to increase in court ordered admissions.</p>

20b	<p>The HSH total admissions and discharges for FY2015 increased modestly. The increase in HSH admissions is directly related to the volume of court orders. The Judiciary in Hawaii is known for placing a large number of individuals who are incarcerated in HSH because the judges are not confident that individuals are receiving the appropriate mental health services within the correctional facilities. This significant trend for FY2015 is also seen as the severity of the charges that result in admission and readmissions. Felonies accounted for 50% of the admissions; 55% of admissions came from the circuit court, and felony admissions increased by 133%.</p>
