6	In December of 2014, Osawatomie State Hospital placed a restriction on voluntary admissions once the census reached 186 patients (20 beds below the licensed capacity of 206). Similarly, Larned State Hospital placed a restriction on voluntary admissions to the Psychiatric Services Program (PSP) in April of 2015 once the census reached 86 patients (18 beds below licensed capacity of 104). This process was developed to better ensure that hospitals did not exceed their licensed capacity by admitting voluntary patients. KSA 59-2949 states that voluntary patients may be admitted to a state psychiatric hospital “when there are available accommodations” for the patients. Because Osawatomie State Hospital had consistently exceeded its licensed capacity during the summer of 2014, limitations on voluntary admissions were retained and continue to the present. Additionally, On June 21, 2015, the Secretary declared a moratorium on admissions to Osawatomie State Hospital in order to complete required building renovations which could not be completed with patients residing there. As a result, sixty beds were taken off line thus reducing licensed capacity from 206 to 146. The moratorium does not close the hospital nor does it stop admissions all together. The moratorium allows the state to control census at a maximum of 146 in order to complete construction.
15	Kansas experienced an increase of 13% in the number of homeless individuals served compared to FY14. Although nearly all CMHCs experienced an increase in the number of homeless individuals served during FY15, the primary cause is due to a series of successful outreach activities by CMHCs in our urban counties that took place during this fiscal year.
