Upon further examination, DSAMH found that providers were not completing the "Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander" race category correctly and were either confusing it for codes for Hispanic Ethnicity or simple choosing it incorrectly. DSAMH will immediately take efforts to provide enhanced instruction to our providers so that this is completed correctly in the future. Unfortunately no corrections are possible at the present time.
3	There are two incongruities between table 2a/2b and Table 3. As explained in the directions, table three duplicates clients across different service levels. Many clients receive more than one type of service in a distinct and separate episode with a different provider in a given year hence the number in table three is larger than the unduplicated count of 2,732 reported in 2A and 2B.
3 & 6	The increase in the number of consumers served in community settings, total admissions to community programs, total number of consumers served in other psychiatric inpatient settings at the beginning of the year, total admissions to residential treatment centers, and total number of consumers served in residential treatment centers at the beginning of the year from 2010 to 2011 is a result of an increased demand for services.
5A & 5B	The decrease in the total number of consumers with both Medicaid and non-Medicaid funding from 2010 to 2011 may be due to more consumers staying on Medicaid due to the economy.
