5A	There is an 18% increase in number of persons with Medicaid and Non-Medicaid over the 2010 number. The total number of persons served also increased over the 2010 number served and the increases are primarily in the population of persons with Medicaid. The percentage of all persons with Medicaid who also have another funding source is essentially unchanged (approximately 1% difference).
6	There was a 26% decrease in total admissions to state hospitals during the year (from 2010). During 2011 state hospitals were being reorganized which affected total admissions during the year.
6	The 48% increase in the total number of consumers served in community programs at the beginning of the year and the 21% decrease in total admissions to community programs during the year (from 2010) are a product of the way that the providers of services report data to the state. At the end of fiscal year 2009, most consumers were "discharged" and then "readmitted" after July 1, 2010 due the changing the state database application. In 2011, consumers active at the end of 2010 were simply carried over into 2011.
6	Total Admissions to Residential Treatment Centers During the Year -- 60% increase from 2010 -- During 2011, a state policy change occurred which resulted in more children in child welfare custody being eligible for MRO services. As many of these children were entering residential treatment facilities, the number of admissions increased in the mental health system database.
6	The average LOS of children (in facility < 1 year) who were state hospital residents at the end of the year decreased by 22% from 2010. The LOS for youth in state hospitals is dependent upon a combination of factors including severity of symptoms and appropriate/available community resources. A one month decrease in LOS is not considered remarkable.
6	The average LOS of adults discharged from state hospitals increased by 62% from 2010. During 2011 state hospitals were being reorganized and concerted efforts were made to discharge persons who were ready for discharge which affected total admissions during the year.
8	MHBG expenditures for non-direct service activities decreased by 40% from 2010. In order to increase funds available for direct services not covered by other funding sources, several non-direct service contract were either not renewed or significantly decreased from 2010 to 2011.
14A	The number of African American consumers with SMI/SED increased by 21% from 2010. Some of the increase is due to increased number of youth receiving MRO services due to the policy change related to child welfare and Medicaid. Approximately 1,000 children and an unknown number of adults associated with these children were affected by this policy change. Minority populations tend to be disproportionately represented in the child welfare system.
16	During SFY 2011, Indiana revised the Medicaid Rehabilitation Option services and eliminated a daily rate for ACT services. As a result of this change, 17 ACT teams were decertified by the providers. Since both Supported Housing and Supported Employment were integrated within the ACT program, consumers who are no longer receiving ACT are now being reported as receiving the specific EBP.
17	The number of consumers receiving Integrated Dual diagnosis services increased from 2010.
