6	The data changed from last year is due to beginning in 2009 DMH began the transition of one Crisis Stabilization Unit to the operation of one Community Mental Health Center. Since then DMH has transitioned the operation of six of the seven CSU's to Community Mental Health Center operation. Prior to 2009, the operations of the Crisis Units were operated under MS State Hospital which only took involuntary commitments. Since the transition, the CSU's have the ability to take not only involuntary commitments, but voluntary admissions also. This allows for the timely access to treatment in the individuals community. Working closely with law enforcement, the CMHC's can administer treatment more rapidly rather than having to hold individuals in jail without treatment that leads to commitment and hospitalization
11	Percent of adults reporting positively about outcomes decreased from last year can be explained that we can only estimate that due to budget cuts over the past few years that the number of services has been effected/reduced. Loss of jobs and housing has reduced opportunities and hope.
12	The increase in Co-Occurring Diagnosis is due to in 2010 DMH received at TTI (Transformation Transfer Initiative) grant. As part of the grant DMH developed and conducted statewide training on the identification and treatment of co-occurring disorders. As a result, all services providers conduct the GAIN Short Screener to all adult consumers that identifies the presence of MH/SA disorders. Early identification leads to more effective treatment of co-occurring disorders.
14A	The increases in Asian and Multi-Racial individuals with SMI/SED are a two-fold explanation. First through extensive cultural Competence training DMH and the service providers are making services available that are culturally, and racially appropriate and more readily available. Secondly, there is a large population of Asian Americans located in the area of our MS Gulf Coast. With the disasters of Katrina and more recently the BP Oil Spill, there has been an increase in the number of Asian American seeking services and there services are being made available in culturally appropriate manner.
