6	While the number of admissions into inpatient units did see an increase, the number of discharges was equally aggressive. More individuals were referred to inpatient facilities program, but as was the case for the Residential Treatment Centers, teams worked diligently to ensure that proper care was provided and that the consumers were back in the community as soon as it was appropriate for them to make that transition. A lot of care planning and coordination by the care coordination, integrated care and residential clinical coordinator teams made that possible. 16	There has been an aggressive movement in training staff in the utilization of evidence-based practices. Additionally, the identification of those services in our system was based partially on self-reporting by the providers. This year, procedure codes were added that made differentiating the specific services provided easier. Additionally, the department has been working on early identification efforts and continues to screen a larger number of children each year for possible mental health issues.
