6	The public mental health system in Indiana is serving more youth from the child welfare system due to opening the Medicaid Rehabilitation Option to those youth. Since many of these youth do receive residential treatment services, the increase in admissions from 2011 to 2012 is likely due to this system change. Indiana has also seen an increase in residential treatment services for other youth but with a reduced length of stay due to making more intensive community services available.
16	More consumers in Indiana are gaining access to Supported Housing services due to increased collaboration between the state housing authority, the state mental health authority, and the public mental health providers. The state housing authority has established a training institute through which a community can access more HUD housing funds for persons with disabilities including mental illness. In each community taking advantage of this opportunity, the local public mental health provider has been one of the community partners attending the institute.
16	The decrease in the number of consumers receiving supported employment services from 2011 to 2012 is due to data reporting issues with a small number of providers. These providers are unable to correct for prior fiscal years data.
16	Therapeutic Foster Care services: the public mental health system in Indiana is serving more youth from the child welfare system due to opening the Medicaid Rehabilitation Option to those youth. Since many of these youth do receive Therapeutic Foster Care services, an increase in admissions is likely due to this system change.
17	There are two primary reasons for the increase in the total number of consumers receiving Integrated Dual Diagnosis Services from 2011 to 2012 in Indiana. Since 2010, most providers have decertified their ACT teams and have been providing modified intensive community treatment services. Since Integrated Dual Diagnosis services were integral to the ACT services, these services are now being reported independently. Additionally, providers have found value in the integrated services for persons with both mental illness and substance abuse and have appropriately responded through increased access to the evidence based practice.
17	There are two primary reasons for the increase in the total number of consumers receiving Illness Self-Management services from 2011 to 2012 in Indiana. Since 2010, most providers have decertified their ACT teams and have been providing modified intensive community treatment services. Illness Self Management services were frequently part of the ACT services and are now being reported independently. Additionally, providers have been increasing accessibility to self management services delivery for persons over the past several years in response to the SMHA's emphasis on a recovery oriented service delivery system.
