15	There are two primary reasons for the increase in the total number of consumers in jail/correctional facility: (1) as outlined above with the transformation efforts, the community providers have improved and expanded their relationships with community entities such as hospitals, judges, jails, correctional facilities, housing authorities, etc. In these efforts to implement and expand preventative and/or diversionary psychiatric treatment, the community providers are more directly involved with care with consumers who need mental health treatment who may appear in these other settings.
