16 & 17	The increase in family psychoeducation services, integrated dual diagnoses services, and the decrease in medication management services are due to: 1) some CMHCs service coverage has expanded as their designation has changed to primary contractors. The change mandated that to access services in a given region, the primary contractor of that region must first assess the person. This resulted in higher numbers for identifying and treating co-occurring disorders; 2) many centers have updated, upgraded, or shifted their data collection systems to databases that are more sophisticated. These systems improvements have rendered capturing EBP data more effective; 3) some centers have revised criteria and policies of EBP implementation. This resulted in increased utilization of EBPs and increased numbers of individuals receiving EBPs that were otherwise underreported in the past.
