5A	The increase in consumers with both Medicaid and Non-Medicaid funding from FY13 to FY14 is due to an increase in consumers receiving Supported Employment services, which include both Medicaid and Non-Medicaid components. In addition, two EBPs—Trauma-Focused Community Based Treatment and Child-Parent Psychotherapy—became Medicaid reimbursable during the fiscal year, so the consumers receiving those services had both Medicaid and Non-Medicaid services during the year.
6	The average LOS for consumers discharged from the state hospital was high, due to a concerted effort to discharge consumers back to the community, including those who had been there for a significant period of time. The longest LOS was 19,863 days, skewing the mean.
6	The concerted effort to discharge consumers from the State Hospital led to more consumers having their acute needs served by community hospitals. DC's policy requires consumers to be treated in community hospitals before being admitted to the state hospital.
6	The effort to discharge consumers from the state hospital led to an increase in consumers accessing community programs. There was also strong outreach to nursing homes and MCOs to enroll appropriate consumers in services.
10	FY2013 Table10 included the funding amount awarded the sub-grantees; however, they received the funds in 2014. Some providers serve both adults and children, so a category was chosen based on the primary population served.
