3	Several factors account for the increase in admissions to state psychiatric hospitals from FY13 to FY14. First, there was a 19% increase in forensic admissions, adding 107 additional consumers. Also, we were able to admit more individuals due to a decrease in the Length of Stay noted in Table 6. Finally, DMH has renewed its focus on discharge planning and serving persons in community settings.
4	Persons with an Employment Status of "Never Employed" had previously been reported as "Unemployed" in the 2013 reporting of Table 4. However, according to MH-CLD instructions, this code has now been mapped to "Not in the Labor Force" for the BCI file submission, accounting for the increase in the total number of consumers not in labor force and the decrease in the total number of consumers unemployed from FY13 to FY14.
6	The increase in total admissions to community program during the year from FY13 to FY14 is a result of the implementation of new contracts for Clubhouse services in July 2013 by DMH. A targeted effort to create enrollment records in the agency electronic record roll resulted in approximately 7,000 new service enrollments.
6	Admissions to psychiatric continuing care units run by the MA DMH, but located in facilities operated by the state Public Health agency are included in the State Hospital category.
6	Individuals admitted to two community mental health centers (CMHCs) delivering acute care and one CMHC providing continuing care are included in "Other Psychiatric Inpatient". This category also includes admissions to private inpatient facilities through contract with the MA DMH.
6	Age group is now calculated at the midpoint of the reporting period to be consistent with the criteria used in construction of the Mental Health Client Level Reporting files.
8	DMH made changes in its expenditures based upon a Block Grant monitoring visit during the summer of 2013. The increase noted in the total MHBG expenditures for non-direct service activities from FY13 to FY14 is the result of funds provided for Mental Health First Aid training to South East Area staff.
12	Child/adolescent services for the MA DMH are provided through age 18, with adult services delivered for ages 19 and older. Calculations for this table use the federal definition of child and adult.
12	Ages 0 to 3 are served primarily by agencies other than the MA DMH, but service authorization criteria for MA DMH does not preclude service provision for this age group.

16	The total number of consumer receiving Supported Housing services is not available for reporting in SFY14. DMH and CBFS providers collaborated in developing the outcome measures that CBFS providers report to DMH as measures of contract performance. While CBFS providers began reporting housing data in January 2011, the data currently collected does not provide sufficient information to determine which individuals are receiving housing supports consistent with the Supported Housing model. DMH and CBFS providers made significant progress in developing a new housing measure set that is consistent with the federal guidance on the reporting of Supported Housing. However, the implementation of these revised measures was delayed due to a service rate development and re-contracting project that is required under the implementation of Chapter 257 of the Acts of 2008. DMH will continue to work towards the reporting of housing data to comply with federal reporting requirements.
16	Supported employment services are provided within several DMH services, including Community Based Flexible Supports (CBFS), Clubhouse and Program for Assertive Community Treatment (PACT). This data reflects only people enrolled in CBFS services who are receiving supported employment.
16	Fidelity for ACT/PACT programs is measured by a team consisting of MA DMH staff, consumers, and a consultant with expertise in ACT, using a scale developed internally, based upon the SAMHSA EBP toolkit. Fidelity is measured every twelve to eighteen months.
16	The decrease in individuals receiving Therapeutic Foster Care in SFY14 is due primarily to increased difficulties in identifying and recruiting foster parents for this group of DMH youth.
16	The total number of children with SED is derived from the eligibility status codes recorded in MHIS. The increase in this population from FY13 to FY14 is due to the child/adolescent field staff's MHIS data cleaning efforts.
17	Although these EBPs may be provided in some DMH programs, they are not reported as discrete services in the Mental Health Information System (MHIS) and are unavailable for reporting.
