6	The total number of consumers served in community programs at the beginning of the year and total admissions to community programs during the year are estimated from a one week survey. The methodology to estimate each metric was corrected this year to interpret "beginning of the year" as "served during the first week of the year" and "admissions" as "all other persons served during the year."
14A	Data in table 14 are point estimates with broad confidence intervals. The 95% CI for 2013 is 531-1261; for 2014 the 95% CI is 860-1977 leading to an increase in the total number of Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander consumers with SMI/SED served.
15	The reported number of incarcerated consumers (consumers in jail/correctional facility) decreased from 2013 to 2014 for two reasons: first, 1/4 of the decrease occurred because, in several areas of New York, mental health services are now provided through contracts with jail-based medical programs rather than mental health programs; second, 3/4 of the decrease occurred because we now report actual residence rather than "incarcerated" for persons jailed for only part of the year.
15	The reported number of persons in private residence and homeless/shelter increased, and persons in institutional settings decreased since from 2013 to 2014 because of a change in reporting guidance. Previously, the living situation for persons in inpatient programs was reported to be "inpatient". Starting this year, except for persons hospitalized for more than a year, the living situation for an inpatient is the residence prior to admission.
16	Funding for the OMH Family Based Treatment was gradually reduced due to underutilization of the program and has ceased effective 3/31. Due to growth in waiver services and implementation of a single point of entry process for determining level of need, community-based services are more available to support families in need.
17	The Family Psychoeducation estimate includes consumers receiving Consumer Centered Family Consultation, a brief 1-5 session intervention that emphasizes information, support and guidance to family members that is practical for adults with SMI. Each year, the Family Psychoeducation training provided by the Family Institute for Education, Practice and Research reaches more families as the number of trained clinicians has expanded. However, we can only report data on the families served by clinicians who are participating in the most recent training initiative and an average on prior initiatives.
21	Psychiatric inpatient readmission data may be incomplete. For example, a readmission would not be included if it occurred after a person lost Medicaid eligibility, or if a person was hospitalized out of state or in the Veteran's Administration system.
