Our HCSIS file was discovered to have duplicate individuals and individuals who were deceased prior to the reporting period. We have worked with the counties to try to resolve these issues. Other options are RTF, Institutionalization and Other inpatient, but we don't include provider type specialty in our output for client level, so the only categories we can report on are state hospital or community or both.
6	It has been discovered that managed care organizations have reported admission and discharge information in different ways, resulting in lack of confidence in these data. Specifically, patients are billed in 1 month periods, showing an admission on 1/1 and discharge on 1/31, and then an admission on 2/1, and so on, with no breaks in client stay, making it difficult to determine a true discharge. OMHSAS is working with the MCOs to assure consistency in reporting to improve data integrity.
