12	The California definitions for SMI and SED were revised for Reporting Year 2017. Previously, both definitions included a valid ICD-9 diagnosis during the reporting year along with a Diagnostic and Statistical Manual (DSM) Global Assessment of Functioning (GAF) scale score below 60. For dates of service beginning October 1, 2015, the State of California shifted mental health diagnostic systems from DSM-IV/International Classification of Diseases-9 (ICD-9) to DSM-5/ICD-10. Since the GAF scale was dropped in DSM-5 these scores are no longer available for the SMI and SED designations. Data for URS and CLD reporting are extracted from the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) Client and Service Information System (CSI). All clients included in the CSI are receiving Specialty Mental Health Services (SMHS) and must therefore meet inclusion criteria as outlined in California statute. The two relevant statues are California Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5600.3 and Title 9, California Code of Regulations, Chapter 11, Medi-Cal Specialty Mental Health Services. These two statutes specify that a client receiving SMHS must have a mental health diagnosis and significant functional impairment in one or more life domains or is at imminent risk of decompensation to having substantial impairments or symptoms. Beginning with Reporting Year 2017 and continuing forward, the SMI and SED designations will be based on an ICD-10 mental health diagnosis along with the Specialty Mental Health Service provider's designation of significant functional impairment. Consequently, any client in the CSI data system will be designated as either SMI, if aged 18 or over, or SED if aged less than 18.
16	The total number of consumers receiving Supported Housing services decreased largely due to incomplete reporting from two County Mental Health Plans; Two County Mental Health Plans had significant increases in Assertive Community Treatment services across a number of centers; Moderate decreases in Multi-systemic Therapy services across three County Mental Health Programs account for most of change between the State Fiscal Year 2014-15 and State Fiscal Year 2015-16.
