The combination of closing a specialty program and the shifting of occupancy to those who stay longer contributed to the drop of admissions from FY17 to FY18. One of our programs that had 87 admissions in FY17 closed at the end of the year. This was a specialized substance abuse treatment program which was not replaced in FY18. Another program had a drop of 17 admissions from the previous year. These two factors account for 104 of the 180 fewer admissions at one of our hospitals. A related factor contributing to fewer admissions is that the State Hospitals had to give higher priority to forensic restoration commitments in FY18 as compared to FY17. These admissions tend to occupy beds far longer, which lowers the rate of admissions. 2) Average LOS of children (in facility <1 year) who were state hospital residents at the end of the year: -25% change between FY2017 and FY2018 - the difference in ratio of Forensic to Civil legal status child LOS on the last day of the fiscal year would explain the drop in average LOS from FY17 to FY18. Forensic patients (particularly ITP restorations) tend to have significantly longer lengths of stay compared to Civil patients. Average Child LOS for FY17 was calculated from the LOS of 11 patients consisting of 9 Forensic (82%) and 2 Civil legal commitments. Most of the forensic patients were committed to the hospital to be restored to competency after having been found incompetent to proceed with their criminal cases. These patients usually have the longest lengths of stay. Average Child LOS for FY18 was calculated from the LOS of 13 patients consisting of 3 forensic commitments (23%) and 10 Civil legal commitments. Not only were there were far fewer forensic patients in this group, two of the three were recent admissions with very small lengths of stay (23 & 25 days) as of 6/30/2018. However, due to a formatting error, percentage of adults with SMI and children with SED with co-occurring SUD were 4% and 1%. This shift is not an artifact of a decrease in services to this population. Rather, the state's method of referencing co-occurring from only a mental health treatment record where the primary diagnosis cannot be an SUD, limits the captured incidence of co-occurring disorders.

Both ACT and IPS are reviewed annually; however, if an ACT service provider scores below "good" fidelity, the provider needs to secure additional training via the SMHA or another source. If a provider scores below "good" fidelity for IPS, the SMHA will conduct another fidelity review every six months until the provider scores "good" fidelity and the SMHA will provide additional training as necessary. Regarding the use of the SAMHSA EBP Toolkits, these kits are used by some program, but some are out dated. The SMHA was told that SAMHSA anticipates updates to some of these toolkits, including IPS, in the next few years. All CMHC had ACT training, arranged by the SMHA, in 2012.
