Coverage in and enrollment in the ACA continues to affect those served by our providers. The Medicaid Authority in the State of Illinois continue to make adjustments in how MCO claims are processed. Last, but not least, FY17 continued to have a lack of coverage for Non-Medicaid services.
2A/B, 3, 4, 5, 5A/B, 6, 12, 14A/B, 15, 15A, 17	The data collected was based solely on SMHA claims data and did not include claims data for individuals treated in the public system whose claims are processed by MCOs. Managed Care has been implemented in Illinois for the past three years, with an increasing number of individuals' claims for publicly funded mental health care processed through the MCOs each year. As an example: in FY17, the SMHA processed claims for 64,403 individuals and the MCOs processed claims for an additional 64,066 for a combined total individuals served in the publicly funded mental health system of 128,469 in FY17.
5A/B	These values are determined by the State Medicaid Authority and how they adjudicate claims. DMH does not have access to the rules for adjudication of claims so we are not able to interpret the increase.
7	2017 data was not reportable because Illinois had a budget impasse for two years and some FY16 expenditures were paid out of FY17 funds, and our tracking mechanism is based on the fund's source year.
8	DMH spent less on staff/fringe and contractual staff in 2017 than we did in 2018.
12	DMH reviews up to 5 behavioral health (BH) diagnosis values that can be collected by our providers during the registration process. These can be any of the mental health and/or substance abuse values. DMH does not control what the provider submits on their registrations. The only requirement is that they select at least one (1) BH diagnosis value.
20A/B, 21	DMH has been working on process changes over the last couple years in attempt to improve the post-hospitalization outcome for discharged patients, which in turn has reduced the number of consumers who are readmitted. These efforts have reduced recidivism at our State Hospitals. We have also seen a reduction in the total number of admissions during the same time, which can be attributed to increased access to community hospitals related to Medicaid Expansion.
