16	Totals for Supported Housing are not available for reporting in SFY18. DMH and CBFS providers collaborated in developing the outcome measures that CBFS providers report to DMH as measures of contract performance. While CBFS providers began reporting housing data in January 2011, the data currently collected does not provide sufficient information to determine which individuals are receiving housing supports consistent with the Supported Housing model. DMH and CBFS providers made significant progress in developing a new housing measure set that is consistent with the federal guidance on the reporting of Supported Housing. However, the implementation of these revised measures was delayed due to a service rate development and re-contracting project that is required under the implementation of Chapter 257 of the Acts of 2008. DMH will continue to work towards the reporting of housing data to comply with federal reporting requirements.

16	Supported Employment services are provided within several DMH services, including Community Based Flexible Supports (CBFS), Clubhouse and Program for Assertive Community Treatment (PACT). This data reflects only people enrolled in CBFS services who are receiving Supported Employment. The decrease in total reported from FY 17 to FY 18 is because with the sunseting of CBFS on 6/30/18, data for Supported Employment was not available for the fourth quarter of the fiscal year.
16	Fidelity for PACT programs is measured using the TMACT tool. The tool is used twice a year to measure fidelity.
17	Although these EBPs may be provided in some DMH programs, they are not reported as discrete services in the Mental Health Information System (MHIS) and are unavailable for reporting.
