2A	Total number of clients served dropped 4% due to changes in Medicaid infrastructure/data reporting to SMHA.
3	Community MH Program counts include clients admitted for ECT and discharged the same day (Per Instruction 3) as well as Forensic Services outpatients. State Hospital Counts include patients who are admitted for ECT treatment and discharged the next day.
3	SMHA observed a 21% decrease in client served under Residential Treatment Centers. We attribute this change to the small Ns.
4A	SMHA noted a 34% increase in "No Dx and Deferred DX" between SFY2018 and SFY2019. This change is observed due to the low N for this field.
5A	SMHA observed a 33% decrease in Medicaid Only clients, and a 19% increase in clients served by Medicaid and Non-Medicaid sources. Explanation: the state Medicaid authority currently contracts with seven regional entities, known as Regional Accountable Entities (RAE), to provide or arrange for medically necessary care, including behavioral health services, to Medicaid-eligible clients. Contracts were recently reorganized as the state shifted from Behavioral Health Organizations (BHO) to RAEs. The Medicaid behavioral health system was predominantly funded through capitation payments to BHOs, and with the change in the Medicaid infrastructure, BHO reporting and sub-capitation between treatment providers resulted in the RAEs having different payment arrangements now with Community Mental Health Centers (CMHC). Although, this has not been formalized. Where BHOs had previously reported data, CMHCs are now responsible for reporting but do not do so. This is a compliance issue within the State, and SMHA is working to address this.
6	SMHA did not report an average or median length for clients in Residential Treatment Center more than one year as no clients were in this location more than one year during SFY2019. Regarding decrease in clients served at beginning of year and admitted to RTCs: SMHA feels this decrease can be attributed to the change in Medicaid infrastructure/data reporting to SMHA.
7	Administration expenditures: in SFY2019, mental health administration was isolated from substance use administration. The state received an increased allocation on the Mental Health Block Grant of \$1.7 million and \$7.2 million for jail based mental health services from the state general fund.
7A	The state increased its spending to meet the 10% set-aside requirement on the increased block grant allocation.
8	The state created 4 data and evaluation prevention positions for services that were previously provided by a contractor. The state is developing a new data system to replace and combine older systems to better meet our data requirements. Personnel costs approximately \$200,000 and information systems update approximately \$200,000.
12	SMHA's method of referencing co-occurring from only a mental health treatment record where the primary diagnosis cannot be an SUD, limits the captured incidence of co-occurring disorders.
14A	The SMHA feels the decrease in the number of multiracial clients can be attributed to the change in Medicaid infrastructure/data reporting to SMHA.
15A	SMHA observed a 20% decrease in client served under Residential Treatment Centers. We attribute this change to the small Ns.
16	The decrease in number of clients receiving supported housing, MST, & ACT is due change to small Ns.
17	SMHA observed a 56% increase in Medication Management. For Medication Management, one CMHC did not have the capacity to report these data in prior years. This issue has been resolved, resulting in the increase.
