5A	The number of consumers in this category keeps decreasing from year to year. Here are some factors that could be contributing to this change: Medicaid expansion in CT has enabled more people to qualify for Medicaid. I have to include our categories “other”, “private insurance”, “self-pay”, and “no insurance” in the non-Medicaid bucket, and these categories continue to decrease. We are continuing to work on cleaning up our insurance data fields – we recently updated a number of Medicaid numbers for billing. I think that we have definitely accounted for more Medicaid and decreased the “unknown” group.
6	Decreases in number of consumers in state hospital/other psychiatric inpatient – CT continues to work to place people in the most appropriate community settings, avoiding inpatient stays, and reducing the length of time spent in the hospital. The Department of Children and Families has shifted beds from its hospital to PRTFs, which also explains the rise in admissions to RTCs.
7	Total MHBG expenditures - Monies increased between 2018 and 2019. Total Medicaid expenditures– more Medicaid billing possible. Total Primary Prevention expenditures – reductions in federal and state funding between 2018 and 2019. Total EBP for ESMI expenditures – DCF funds above the 10% rate due to uncertainty of funding. Total State Hospital expenditures – increased Medicaid billing and state funding. Other 24 Hour Care expenditures – state and other federal funds reduced from 2018 to 2019. Total Ambulatory/Community non-24 hour care expenditures – increases in state, other federal, and block grant funding.
7A	Increased funding from MHBG.
15	DCF closed the Connecticut Juvenile Training School- and officially ended its involvement with juvenile justice work - at the end of FY2018. The youth who were at this school had not been included in URS tables; some of them are now often in detention and in contracted MH services that are now being counted for URS. Additionally, DCF has been working to be more trauma sensitive and aware and has improved treatment coordination for youth in detention.
