9	Percent of children/adolescents reporting positively about Functioning: two primary factors are likely to have contributed to change in reporting from 2018 to 2019 for positively reporting about functioning. First, there was a 17% decrease in the number of responses returned for the consumer survey in 2019. Factors we believe contributed to this is that there were two surveys given to consumers this year related to YES/Wraparound; one through DHW and the other through Boise State University. We believe that there may have been a decrease in returned surveys because consumers may have assumed they had already responded to one survey about services and therefore responding to a separate survey about the same services was either redundant or a waste of their time. We also suspect non-response bias may have factored into the decrease in positive responses, as consumers who are dissatisfied with services are more likely to respond to surveys than are consumers who are satisfied with services.
11	Percent of children/adolescents reporting positively about outcomes: the factors cited for table nine are believed to apply to table 11. The same survey was used to gather consumer reporting for child/adolescent outcomes as was used for child/adolescent functioning. We believe that there were fewer surveys returned due to families receiving a survey from DHW and from Boise State University, and that those who did respond were likely to respond more negatively.
12	Percent of adults served by the SMHA with co-occurring MH/SA diagnoses: entering SA diagnosis was practice but not a requirement in the past, however, because it is not a requirement to enter a SA diagnosis, we suspect some clinicians are not documenting it in instances wherein contact with the client amounts to a brief crisis encounter (screening) or is someone being screened by a DE.
12	Percent of children served by the SMHA with co-occurring MH/SA diagnoses: our state experienced an increase in reported co-occurring MH/SA diagnosis because reporting SA is required in CANS and consequently clinicians are reporting the co-occurring diagnosis in the WITS EHR.

16	Total number of children with SED: due to the children's mental health model in Idaho, the Youth Empowerment Service, more children are receiving services. Both wraparound providers and PCPs are identifying SED and they enter the data into the WITS EHR, which is increasing the number of children identified with SED in Idaho.
16	Total number of consumers receiving Supported Employment services: following a deeper investigation into the data, and discussion with key informants we are unclear why there is a higher dropout rate than usual this year for supported employment services. DBH refers to the Idaho Division of Vocational Rehabilitation monthly reports for this information. They report that there has been an increase in the dropout percentage, but we are continuing to explore why the increase is occurring as it is not clear from the IDVR reports.
