3	Ongoing trend of decreasing clients served in state psychiatric hospitals in Kentucky since 2011: for many years, DBHDID has working to divert persons from psychiatric hospitalization. Some funds that would have gone to the psychiatric hospitals were diverted to use in the community. In the early 2000s, funds that would have been used to open another unit at WSH were instead sent to the CMHCs to provide additional services in the community and to divert from hospitalization. Diversion was expanded in 2013-2014, reallocating other institutional funds to the community to cover Assertive Community Treatment, Supportive Housing, Supported Employment, and Peer Support. These initiatives have resulted in fewer admissions to the psychiatric hospitals.
5A	Increase in consumers with both Medicaid and non-Medicaid funding: this may be related to the increased engagement of persons served in community-based services and decreased hospital admissions. Additionally, our Department for Medicaid Services now reimburses more behavioral health services in the past; thus, more Medicaid clients would be served.
6	Kentucky does not serve children in state psychiatric hospitals; the 5 children reported in 2018 were reported in error. Total number of children should have been zero in 2018 as well as in 2019.
7	The state use of DSH funds increased from 2018. The state Medicaid regulation changed during 2019 to include more coverage for IMDs; thus, the state Medicaid funded more state hospital stays associated with the new IMD coverage. Other Federal Funds expenditures were impacted by a change to State Hospital expenditures, Ambulatory expenditures, and Administration expenditures. Those three changed between 2018 and 2019 due to the following: State Hospital: decrease in Federal funds may be an indirect impact of the IMD regulation change stated above (Medicaid began covering state hospital stays). Additional explanation may be related to a possible decrease in Medicare-eligible clients admitted to the hospitals. Ambulatory: our state's CABHI grant ended during 2019; thus less Federal funds were used during 2019. Administration: funds shifted from using Federal funds (2018) to using state funds (2019).
12	Increase in clients with co-occurring MH/SUD: Kentucky was the recipient of additional federal funding related to opioid use. With those additional funds, the Department has been able to facilitate services for additional persons having substance use diagnoses.
14A	SMI Definition: as defined in KRS 210.005, "chronic" (mental illness) means that clinically significant symptoms of mental illness have persisted in the individual for a continuous period of at least two (2) years, or that the individual is presently and significantly impaired in his ability to function socially or occupationally or both; and 2. 15	It is possible that the increase in homeless persons served is due to improved data reporting. The total numbers in increased from 2018 to 2019 in all categories except the "NA" and "Institutional Setting" – both of which decreased. It appears that increase in all categories was due to the improved reporting and reduced use of the category of "NA".
