3	The downward trend in the number of clients served in state psychiatric hospitals in New Jersey is a result of the Olmstead Settlement Agreement. Although the Olmstead Settlement Agreement was a result of a lawsuit initiated in 2005, this settlement resulted in an investment in the mental health system in needed community residential and other services. The Olmstead Settlement Agreement called for the following indicators of improved community integration, each with its own individual targets for every year covered by the Settlement Agreement: 1. Creation of community-based (i.e. Supportive Housing) placements; 2. Discharge of long-term CEPP consumers awaiting discharge since July 1, 2008 or prior; 3. Increased rates of discharge within four to six months of CEPP designation. The successful implementation of the Olmstead Settlement Agreement led to the continuous decrease of census in the state hospitals and the number served.
6	The New Jersey Olmstead Initiatives developed a pilot program in January 2019 with Centralized Admissions to divert admissions from the state psychiatric hospitals. The purpose of the pilot was to keep individuals in the community with the appropriate services. This pilot has been successful resulting in a decrease in total admissions to state hospitals during the year from FY 2018 to FY2019.

7	Increase the Grand Total Expenditure from SFY 2018 to SFY 2019: see Table 7 note for our explanation with respect to total MHBG Expenditures. Also, in summary, the Division understated the SFY 2018 portion of the First Episode Psychosis (FEP) - we have included entire amount of the SFY 2019 FEP expenditures. Community Care has increased due to the awarded amount increasing from the previous year. The Medicaid methodology has been changed, prior reports included only Department of Children's and Families - Children's System of Care Medicaid figures (DCF-CSOC). We have included both Adult Medicaid spending and Children's Medicaid (DCF-CSOC) spending, which increased the figures. The actual expenditures for Planning Council have also increased.
