All tables with patient served counts	Increase in unduplicated patient counts from the previous year are reflective of implementation of a level of care protocol and accompanying electronic medical record tools that provide improved patient tracking throughout the outpatient treatment episode. The protocol and tools are designed to help case managers and clinicians improve patient service utilization and target outreach methods to individuals that have missed appointments. The implementation process has provided centers with the ability to better manage case load roles and provide engagement outreach beyond administrative discharge/treatment episode planning. 11/11A	The state continued to pilot a brief patient service survey during the reporting year in an effort to respond to feedback regarding the use of a longer patient care survey that attempted to address multiple information needs. The revised survey focused on gathering feedback regarding that day's appointment (all patients with appointments during the Month of May 2019 were offered an opportunity to complete the five question survey) in an effort to improve respondent recall, participation, completion rate, and question comprehension. Results indicated that the survey was well received by both administrators and respondents. Future revisions during the current reporting period will work to add essential items that were omitted from the prior survey instrument into the electronic medical record or to future survey revisions. Data presented in these tables reflects completed surveys tied to appointments. Some duplication exists for patients that had more than one appointment during the month. Data can be unduplicated at the patient level for those patients whose survey included a valid patient ID # (approximately 2% of surveys did not contain a patient number). Data displayed in these tables is limited to those surveys with a patient number in order to display the data based on race, ethnicity, and age criteria.
