The bill also authorized the shift of licensing and certification of behavioral health providers to the Department of Health (DOH). DSHS will continue to oversee the state's two psychiatric facilities (Eastern and Western State hospitals) as well as the Child Study and Treatment Center, effective on July 1, 2018. While we have been continuing to conduct the validation testing of behavioral health data, the migration of data is still not fully realized, much less finalized. This is the primary reason that explains the percentage changes from 2018 to 2019.</p>
<p>7</p>	<p>1) State: In July 2018, one of Washington's state hospitals was decertified, resulting in a decrease in federal funding and increase in state funding; 2) Local: The decrease in local admin funding is due to a Certification program that was transferred to the WA Department of Health (DOH) at the start of fiscal year 2019, as well as a decreased use of local as match in some regions. Due to the state hospital decertification, Medicaid and Medicare (with the exception of Part D drugs) could no longer be billed. Also, some insurance companies would use the decertification to deny payments.
