3	Per the feedback we received last year, we worked on a method this year to include all state mental health institute admissions in our data to which the increase from 2017 to 2018 can be attributed. The state mental health institute admission data is in a different data system than what public county agencies use to submit the standard MHBG-required data to us. However, we were able to merge the two data sets and at least include the institute admissions even though the NOMS, for example, are not available for institute admissions. We plan to continue this method going forward. The trend variations from 2012-14 are mostly due to the implementation of a new statewide data system and likely not reflective of the actual census.
5A	Wisconsin cannot identify Medicaid Only clients with its statewide community data system, but the state mental health institute data system does include Medicaid funding information which is the source of the Medicaid Only clients this year.
6	Some of the increase in State Hospital figures are due to the inclusion of all state mental health institute hospitalizations this year. Some of the increase is due to a re-categorization of Other Hospitals into the State Hospital category. We discovered some counties are incorrectly reporting hospital provider IDs. We fixed this issue in the 2018 data which caused some Other Hospitals to be re-categorized as State Hospitals. This also accounts for the decrease in Other Hospitals. The increase in LOS for adults is driven by the inclusion of all state MH institute forensic clients who sometimes have very long stays. The decrease in LOS for youth is driven by state MH institute admissions which are usually short-term civil emergency detentions for youth. After reviewing multiple years of inconsistent data, we have determined the residential treatment center data reported by counties to the State is unreliable. We will work on improving the treatment data submissions and restart URS reporting when fixed.
7	The decline in Other expenditures is due to the ending of a grant. The increase in State Hospital expenditures is a normal fluctuation dependent on number of admissions, staff over time, changes in bed capacity, etc. In 2017, the figure was \$87 million which is right in between the 2018 and 2019 totals. The increase in Administration expenditures is mostly due to an increase in the MHBG.
8	The increase in expenditures for non-direct service activities is due to an increase in the MHBG. One new MHBG expenditure included a Behavioral Health Gaps study to further examine the state's needs to address with the MHBG.
11	The increase in youth feeling positive about their outcomes is accurate and likely due to the continuing effort in Wisconsin to expand the service array and improve the use of wraparound services in its Coordinated Service Teams initiative for youth with SED.
14A/B	State definition of SMI/SED is similar to federal definition, but worded differently: "Persons in need of ongoing, high intensity, comprehensive services - have a primary diagnosis of a major mental illness or severe emotional disturbance, and they have substantial needs for psychiatric and medical treatment, including substance abuse, daily living skills, budgeting, job training, family support and support at school. Some may have a history of trauma, such as physical or sexual abuse or neglect, which contributes to the mental health problem. Persons in this category may need help to access community resources, such as safe, affordable housing, benefits and entitlements, and legal assistance. They need support and assistance in combating stigma and discrimination. Without ongoing, comprehensive services, these persons will be at the highest risk for increased psychiatric hospitalizations or extensive reliance on placement in nursing homes, child-caring institutions, and other supervised settings; confinement in jail; homelessness; and increased harm to self. These persons will sometimes experience acute psychiatric crises as a result of increases in symptoms of mental illness or environmental stresses. Because some may be reluctant to access mental health or other services, extensive outreach may be needed to engage them into services. The person and family need ongoing, comprehensive treatment and intensive community support and wraparound services to help them achieve and maintain a more stable level of functioning and a lifestyle relying more on natural supports and less on formal mental health services." State definition also includes this group: "Persons in Need of Ongoing Low Intensity Services - have a diagnosed mental disorder. They function in a fairly stable manner but may occasionally experience acute psychiatric crises. Some may have a history of trauma, such as physical or sexual abuse or neglect, which contributes to the mental health problem. These persons need services such as ongoing medication management (prescription, evaluation, and monitoring), case management, and/or periodic support contacts. With the benefit of such services, they are usually able to live relatively independently and have good potential for recovery and increasing success in community living. Without ongoing supports and services, however, they can be at a serious risk for relapse and for much more costly treatment, including intensive crisis intervention and psychiatric hospitalization."
20A/B	The state mental health institutes operate in a different data system and previously we have relied on our county partners reporting clients who receive services from the institutes, which they do with varying completeness. This year, we've pulled the data directly from the institute system to complement that information and make our reporting more complete. We plan to continue doing this in future reporting years.
