6	The change in percentages from 2019 to 2020 is linked to COVID-19. When the pandemic hit, admissions to hospitals and residential treatment facilities halted. Also, court systems closed so there was a decrease in ADMH commitments to include Juvenile Civil Commitments, Adult Probate Civil Commitments, and Adult Forensic Commitments. Because of the pandemic, admissions to any programs decreased and LOS increased.
