Data on individuals employed is very limited with only 10.69% of individuals that received a mental health service have an updated employment status in 2020 reporting and 9.26% individuals that received a mental health service have an updated employment status in 2019 reporting.
5A	Non-Medicaid funding for Pennsylvania is primarily the County Base Funded Mental Health program. This program has had difficulty in providing accurate and complete encounter data to the state. Pennsylvania continues to work with the Pennsylvania counties to submit encounters timely and accurately. The increase in the total number of individuals and individuals with both Medicaid and Non-Medicaid funding for mental health services is a direct result of these efforts and is the increase in submitted encounters. It is expected to continue to see increases in this data each reporting year.
6	Pennsylvania continues to manage an initiative to reduce the number of days an individual needs to wait for treatment in a forensic level of care in the Pennsylvania State Mental Health Hospital system. Therefore, more individuals are being admitted to the Pennsylvania State Mental Health Hospital system and likewise individuals that are determined competent during competency assessment reviews are being discharged from the Pennsylvania State Mental Health Hospital system. Therefore, there has also been a decrease in the length of stay as many individuals that have been determined competent through the competency assessments are being discharged more timely to make additional room for individuals waiting for admission.
