5	The State has been continually working on getting more clients who are eligible to be covered by medicaid and on enrolling clients who qualify in medicaid covered services into those services and to utilize block grant dollars as a safety net for clients/situations when medicaid is not available.
6	We believe that these changes in service provision were largely due to impacts of the COVID-19 crisis which impacted service provision, particularly when there were in-person components to treatment due to new protocols such as social distancing measures.
7	Total MHBG Expenditures: The State under spent the Mental Health Block Grant in SFY2019 and accelerated spending in existing programs for SFY2020 in order to spend the \$4.3 million increase in funding received from two awards. An additional 2 million dollars was spent on new direct services programs for crisis, recovery and co-responder services. An additional \$750 thousand was spent on program development and needs assessment. \$850 thousand was spent in quarter 4 of SFY2020 for COVID-19 mitigation to maintain critical services prior to the availability of CARES Act funding. Total Other Funds Expenditures: Increase of \$1.2 million of Medicare revenues at the state hospital. Increased spending of \$800 thousand in the System of Care COACT Grant. Total Local Expenditures: These revenues are from first and third party payers and will vary from year to year. Total Local Funds Expenditures: Local funding available to the state hospital varies from year to year. Total EBP for ESMI Expenditures: The ESMI program was expanded to maintain the required 10% set-aside requirement due to the increase in the State's allocation. Total Ambulatory/Community Non-24-Hour Care Expenditures: There was increased spending of \$7.8 million of block grant funding in SFY2020. The State allocated 8 million dollars for new jail diversion and jail-based services in SFY2020. The State spent an additional \$2 million in SFY2020 expanding the program for individuals who had significant barriers to discharge from the state hospital. The 15% change in the administration costs was due to the increased spending in the Mental Health Block Grant for 2020.
7A	The ESMI program was expanded to maintain the required 10% set-aside requirement due to the increase in the State's allocation.
8	Senate Bill 19-222 sets out requirements to improve access to behavioral health services for individuals at risk of institutionalization. The increased spending includes \$500 thousand for needs assessment and \$600 thousand for program development, information systems, and quality assurance and improvement.
11	The decrease in client reporting positively about outcomes could be due to a variety of circumstances, although we cannot conclusively determine why this change occurred. It is possible that the COVID-19 pandemic that occurred throughout 2020, which impacted service provision, modalities, and client symptoms, may have also influenced clients perceptions of their outcomes. Several questions asked clients to compare their current situation to "12 months ago" which could be more negative given the systematic events occurring this year that did not exist in the prior year. Additionally, there was an ongoing review of the behavioral health care system in Colorado throughout the year which identified key stakeholders, including clients, about ways the system could improve. It is possible, that this inadvertently increase client focus on the areas of improvement and thus lead to less satisfaction overall.
15	The change in number of clients can be attributed to the overall small n. Though a 26% change, the number of increase in clients is not substantial.
16	The decrease in number of clients receiving the EBP types of supported housing, supported employment, ACT, and family functional therapy is due to change and the result of smaller reported Ns. Per CO EBP program staff, the onset of COVID-19 also decreased the ability for these programs to provide services to clients, even with funding increases. In addition to COVID-19, program staff reports that CMHCs are able to switch the EBP offered at their own discretion. Supported housing also decreased from 2018 to 2019, so the decrease in 2020 is a continuation of this trend for CO CMHCs. The increase in MST services is due to change and the result of larger reported Ns from CMHC providers who offer this EBP.
17	For medication management services, the difference in the gender count is the result of EBP data being collected from separate databases and the database does not allow reconciliation between the key mental health data set (CCAR) and the separate EBP data set. The decrease in number of clients receiving family psychoeducation and integrated dual dx services services is due to change and the result of smaller reported Ns. Similarly, the increase in clients receiving illness self-management services is due to change and the result of larger reports Ns from CMHC providers.

Given the unpredictability of COVID-19, individuals have experienced longer wait times to be admitted (e.g., Jails on lockdown due to positive cases, MHIs on COVID precautions). This has resulted in admitted patients taking a longer period of time to stabilize psychiatrically.
