



# **Errata for Key Substance Use and Mental Health Indicators in the United States: Results from the 2021 National Survey on Drug Use and Health**

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## **Originating Office**

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A misstatement was identified in the *Key Substance Use and Mental Health Indicators in the United States: Results from the 2021 National Survey on Drug Use and Health* report. The third paragraph in the “General Substance Use in the Past Month” section incorrectly states that tables in Appendix A include estimates of past month use for the following substances: gamma hydroxybutyrate (GHB), the misuse of nonprescription cold and cough medicine, kratom, synthetic marijuana (fake weed, K2, or Spice), and synthetic stimulants (“bath salts” or flakka). Estimates of the use of these substances in the past month were removed from Appendix A tables for the 2021 report but can be found in the *Results from the 2021 National Survey on Drug Use and Health: Detailed Tables* (see <https://www.samhsa.gov/data/report/2021-nsduh-detailed-tables>). Therefore, this statement also should have been removed from the main body of the report. However, this statement does not affect the accuracy of any statements about estimates elsewhere in the report.



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
