

2023 Uniform Reporting Summary Output Tables Executive Summary

State Mental Health Agencies (SMHAs) compile and report annual data as part of SAMHSA's Community Mental Health Services Block Grant Report requirements. These compiled data constitute the Uniform Reporting System (URS).

The URS is comprised of 25 tables that are developed by SAMHSA in consultation with SMHAs. The 2023 URS Output Tables present findings from 58 states and U.S. territories. The U.S. Virgin Islands was omitted because they did not submit any data. Each output table provides summary information on the SMHA clients served in 2023: sociodemographic characteristics of clients served, outcomes of care, use of selected evidence-based practices, client assessment of care, Medicaid funding status, living situation, employment status, crisis response services, and readmission to state psychiatric hospitals within 30 and 180 days. Key data highlights are listed below:

- In 2023, 8,253,780 clients received SMHA services from 58 states and U.S. territories/jurisdictions. This is an increase from 8,180,236 clients served by the SMHAs in 2022. There were 6,015,438 adults (or 23.0 per 1,000), 2,229,152 children (or 30.7 per 1,000) served. Age data was missing for 9,190 (0.1 percent) clients served.
- Among SMHA clients, there were 4,418,899 (53.5 percent) females served while there were 3,766,336 (45.6 percent) males served. In the majority of states (41), more females were served than males, and in the remaining states (17), more males were served than females.
- The age distribution of SMHA clients served was the largest among ages 25-44 with 33.2 percent, followed by ages 45-64 with 22.5 percent, children ages 13-17 with 12.7 percent, and children ages 6-12 with 11.8 percent.
- Over half of SMHA clients served were White, comprising the largest racial category at 56.8 percent; Black or African American clients comprised the next largest group with 17.3 percent. Race data was missing for 12.5 percent of clients served. When looking at ethnicity, the majority of SMHA clients served were non-Hispanic (68.5 percent), while 15.2 percent were Hispanic.
