Broadening our Base:

By reaching out to communities of faith, LGBTQ, Latino, African American, labor, and more, UNITE to Face Addiction will demonstrate how addiction solutions benefit all Americans.

Why 2015?

- The Affordable Care Act has ushered in a new era – alcohol and other drug problems are treated on equal footing with other health conditions.
- Recognition across the political spectrum that current rates of incarceration, including for alcohol and other drug related offenses, can't be sustained and that they are harmful to families and communities.
- Heightened awareness of the opiate overdose epidemic.
- A growing recognition of the impact of discrimination towards people with substance use disorders and the need to dismantle legal and societal manifestations of discrimination.

Why Now?

- We know that addiction is preventable, treatable, and that people can and do get well.
- Until now, the great majority of people connected to addiction have remained silent.
- The opioid epidemic and spike in overdose deaths require a response and provide an opportunity to engage policy makers and the public to find solutions.
