

Dr. Hendree Jones is Executive Director of Horizons, a drug treatment program for pregnant and parenting women and their children. At the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, she is an Adjunct Professor in the Department of Psychology and a Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology. She is also an Adjunct Professor in the Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences and in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Johns Hopkins University's School of Medicine.



Dr. Nancy Goler is a Board Certified Obstetrician/Gynecologist. She is the Regional Medical Director for Kaiser Permanente's Early Start Program and the Assistant Regional Clinical Director of Appointment and Advice Call Center. She also oversees Kaiser's Wellness Coaching program and Patient Outreach Support Team.
